



The Fourth Congressional District includes municipalities located throughout [Allegheny County](#), including the North Hills, Alle-Kiski Valley, and Quaker Valley. Congressman Altmire frequently visits with local residents, tours area businesses, and attends community events. He has held town halls and Congress on Your Corner events in Allison Park, Harmar Township, Natrona Heights, Plum Borough, Richland Township, Ross Township, and Shaler Township, to name a few. Here are additional details about Congressman Altmire's activities in Allegheny County:

Extended Tax Cuts for Allegheny County Families

In December 2010, Congressman Altmire voted to extend all of the 2001 and 2003 tax cuts through the end of 2012. The Middle Class Tax Relief Act -- which went into effect on December 17, 2010 -- will help provide Americans with the certainty needed to make long-term investments and spur job growth by extending the current lower tax rates for another two years. Championing the Repeal of the 1099 Provision in the Health Care Reform Law

Congressman Altmire is a cosponsor of the Small Business Paperwork Mandate Elimination Act which repeals the 1099 provision in the health care reform law. The Act eliminates the requirement that small businesses file a 1099 tax form for every business from which they have purchased more than \$600 in goods and services in a single year. The 1099 provision is a burden on small businesses and its repeal will allow them to focus on growing and creating jobs, instead of filling out unnecessary paperwork. Educating Senior Citizens on Consumer Fraud

In July 2011, Congressman Altmire's office, in conjunction with State Representative Frank Dermody's office hosted three seminars aimed at educating senior citizens on ways to prevent identity theft and other cases of consumer fraud in Oakmont, Plum and Tarentum. Officials from

North Park Lake Ecosystem Restoration Project

In June 2011, Congressman Altmire along with Allegheny County Executive Dan Onorato officially re-opened North Park Lake to the community after several years of restoration. In September of 2009, Congressman Altmire joined with Allegheny County Executive Dan Onorato and other officials from McCandless, Pine and Hampton townships to officially launch the North Park Lake Ecosystem Restoration Project. Congressman Altmire helped to provide the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers with the \$5 million in federal funding that it needs to carry out this important project, which will help to restore much of the lake's original depth and preserve its fish and wildlife habitats.

Harrison Township Community Center



In April of 2010, Congressman Altmire joined with local community members to break ground on the new Harrison Township Community Center. Congressman Altmire secured \$400,000 in the Fiscal Year 2009 federal budget to help create this new community center, which will house a basketball court, tutoring programs and a variety of other after-school programs for local families.

Talking to Local Teachers about No Child Left Behind

During the summer of 2010, Congressman Altmire met with dozens of educators in the North Hills and the Alle-Kiski Valley to discuss how to improve the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB), the law that covers federal aid and programs for elementary and secondary schools (K-12). As a member of the House Education and Labor Committee, Congressman Altmire will play a key role in rewriting NCLB over the next year.

Small Business “Access to Capital” Workshop at La Roche College

In August of 2009, Congressman Altmire held a workshop at La Roche College that provided more than 90 local entrepreneurs with helpful information about how to obtain capital in today's tough economy. Featured speakers at the event included representatives from the U.S. Small

Congressman Altmire secured \$142,500 in the Fiscal Year 2009 federal budget to help transform the old Natrona Ballfield into the Natrona Recreation and Art Park. This remodeled park will be the cornerstone for Natrona's revitalization and will help to attract new families and new businesses to the town. It is expected that the park will also help to lower crime rates by providing young people with a safe place where they can engage in community and educational activities. In recent months, however, many non-profits throughout western Pennsylvania have struggled to make ends meet amidst increased demands and declining revenues. To help non-profits serve their communities, Congressman Altmire held a non-profit grants workshop in Springdale, PA in August of 2009. At this workshop, representatives from federal and state agencies shared information about what government grants are available for non-profits and what non-profits can do to improve their applications.
