

Altmire: Western Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Set to Receive Funding from Economic Recovery Package

(WASHINGTON, D.C.) -- U.S. Congressman Jason Altmire (PA-04) today announced that 12 communities in Pennsylvania's Fourth Congressional District will receive more than \$380,000 as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, an economic recovery package supported by Congressman Altmire that was signed into law last month.

(WASHINGTON, D.C.) -- U.S. Congressman Jason Altmire (PA-04) today announced that 12 communities in Pennsylvania's Fourth Congressional District will receive more than \$380,000 as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, an economic recovery package supported by Congressman Altmire that was signed into law last month. Local law enforcement agencies will be able to use these funds to support a broad range of activities aimed at preventing and controlling crime.

"During this recession, it is critically important that we ensure our cash-strapped police departments have the resources they need," Altmire said. "The funding local law enforcement is receiving as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act will help them keep our families safe and prevent an increase in crime that could lead to declining property values, business closings, and job losses. Increased support for our local law enforcement agencies is just one of the many ways our region is going to benefit from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act."

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act increased funding for several initiatives that will help Pennsylvania law enforcement agencies keep officers on staff and enhance public safety. This \$380,000 is part of more than \$73 million Pennsylvania will receive through the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program. Pennsylvania law enforcement will also be able to apply for additional, competitively-awarded grant funding from the COPS program, which is receiving \$1 billion to help departments nationwide improve their community policing and crime prevention efforts.
